View "The Genocide Convention: A Call to Action." As student watch the short film, they should write down any responses or questions they have.

- Debrief by asking students to share their responses or questions.
- 2. Allow time for discussion amongst the class, then discuss the following questions:

- a. What are the lessons to be learned? Who needs to learn these lessons?
 - Answers may include: perpetrators, the international community, bystanders, etc.
- b. Why is it so important to honor the victims and survivors of genocide?
- c. In what ways do we honor them?

 Answers may include: testimonies, memorials, commitment to fight prejudice, etc.
- 3. Eugenie Mukeshimana, a survivor of the Rwandan genocide refers to genocide as a "collective failure." She also states that we can provide a "collective response." (2:08)
 - a. How is genocide a "collective failure"?
 - b. What are some of the actions that make up a "collective response"?
 - c. Who should respond?
 - d. How?

 Answers may include: social media campaigns, media coverage, UN resolutions, criminal prosecution, etc.
